





Question text







- What have been the most significant ideas, concepts or skills that you have gained from this course?
- A greater understanding of the American Prison systems, history of prisons, and different structures and security levels of institutions around the U.S.
- An open mind about the prison system and how people are incarcerated.
- Architecture in Prisons.
- Conditions of incarceration, racism in the prison system, ending cycles of failure.
- Everything I have mentioned above. I have learned so much especially about the recidivism rates, of all the prisoners that get released 70% who are released are back in incarceration within 3years. The prison system is not successful if the rates are only 30% are "passing" by not re-entering into incarceration. I was taught the recidivism rates and how much a prisoner costs per year to incarcerate is between 44,000-100,000 depending on the state and the security level of the prison.
