Dear Michael:

On behalf of San Francisco State University, College of Health and Social Sciences, Program in Criminal Justice Studies, I write to extend an offer for you to join us as a guest lecturer. I would like you to teach a course listed in our catalog as *The Architecture of Incarceration*.

This course meets in class for approximately three hours each week during the semester. You may choose to teach the class one night each week for two hours and forty-five minutes, or you may choose to teach the course on two afternoons each week for one and a half hours each session. The 16-week semester begins on August 26, 2013 and concludes on December 16, 2013. It pays the regular guest lecture rate that will amount to roughly \$4,000 for the semester.
